Crew Leading/Volunteer workflow

- Decide to do work
 - Confirm trail is in COTA's Volunteer Agreement (VSA) or approved by land manager
 - They have a project
 - Who do they tell when going out? (With a crew or solo)
 - They need to identify a project
 - Who do they contact to find one?
 - Maintenance log, chapter rep, other crew leaders, Trails PM
- Project Identification
 - Visit work site
 - Flag and mark area (Ask for help if needed)
 - Make plan of work (How to fix problem)
 - Identify the help you need, if any (Co-leader, sawyer?)
 - Size of crew
 - New Crew Leaders: 1 CL to 4 volunteers
 - Work with a Co-leader if you would like a larger group
 - Experience Crew Leaders: 1 CL to 8 volunteers
 - Tools needed
 - Length of time to complete project
- Posting
 - Bend Crew leaders email list
 - How do we make sure people aren't planning to do the same work
 - Some trails need small work parties and shouldn't be posted on MeetUp
 - Meet up group
 - Review steps on how to do this: Video here
 - Details to add: what to expect, what to bring, where to meet, any other details
- Pre-Logistics
 - Check out tools and helmets from chapter trailer or Bunker
- Meet Group
 - Sign in
 - Start on time
 - Safety talk and Helmets/PPE
- Work
 - Travel to work site
 - Discuss/demonstrate work and desired outcomes/goals
 - Don't take on more than your group/time allows
 - We want to leave high quality, completed work
 - Split into groups and work
 - Check between groups (You are here to coordinate and tend not to get much work in)
 - o Finish up work, make sure you have everyone and all tools
- Post Work
 - Thank all volunteers
 - o Remind volunteers to log their hours (mention chapter, zone and trail)
 - Return tools
 - Log work party hours
 - o Update maintenance log for Bend or notify chapter rep when work is completed
